TOWNSHIP LEVY

*The Township must collect taxes on behalf of the County and School Boards. As such, only part of your tax bill is controlled by the Township of Stone Mills.

Invested in General Government

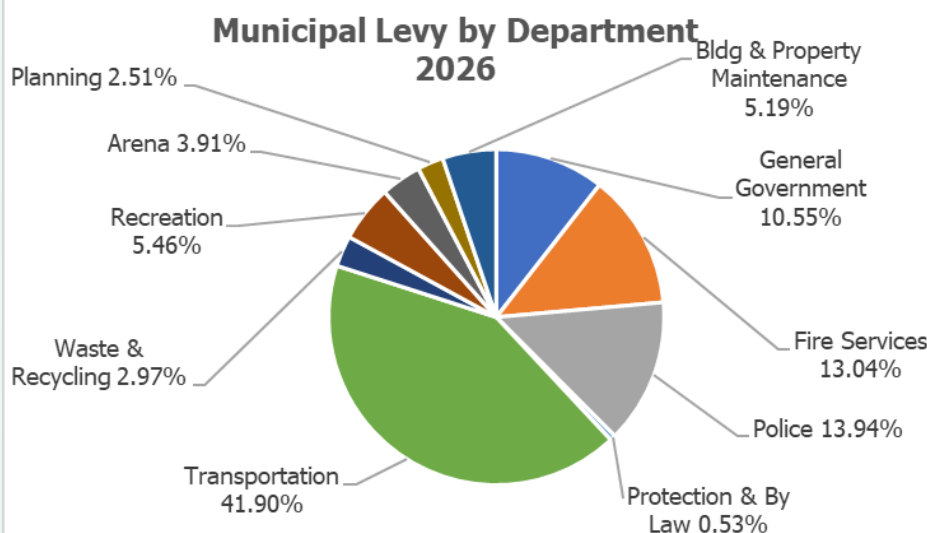
This includes internal services such as the Clerk's office, Finance, Human Resources & Council.

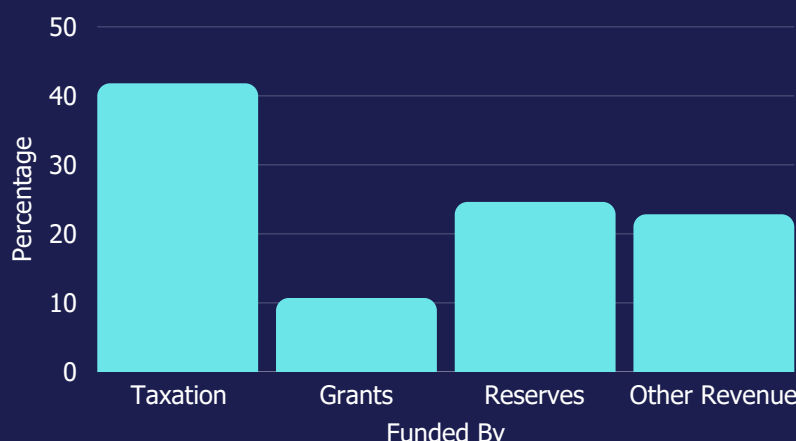
Invested in Policing

Municipal and School Board Elections Happening October 26, 2026

The next Municipal and School Board Election, will take place on Monday, October 26, 2026 and the newly elected Council will serve a 4-year term. The Council of the Township of Stone Mills consists of a Mayor, a Deputy Mayor and five council members who are elected at large.

Township of Stone Mills has adopted a By-law which will permit a voting period using Internet or Telephone voting methods. The Voting period will open on Monday, October 19, 2026 at 10:00 am and close on Monday, October 26, 2026 at 8:00 p.m. Paper ballot voting will only be offered on Monday, October 26, 2026, at select location between the hours of 10:00 am and 8:00 pm.

Considering a run for Municipal Council or School Board Trustee in the October 2026 election? To run as a Municipal or School Board Candidate, on the day the nomination paper is filed, a person must be:

- a Canadian citizen
- at least 18 years old
- a resident of the Township of Stone Mills, or an owner or tenant of land in the Township of Stone Mills, or the spouse of such person
- not legally prohibited from voting
- not disqualified by any legislation from holding municipal office

To vote in the next Municipal and School Board election, you must be:

- A Canadian citizen; and
- 18 years of age or older; and
- A resident of the Township of Stone Mills; or
- A non-resident who is, or whose spouse is, an owner or tenant of land in the Township of Stone Mills; and
- Not prohibited from voting by law
